This course will cover ethical challenges in dementia care facing social workers in various sections of the continuum. Decisional capacity, patient rights, and end of life care are all areas of focus as we explore ways to address best practices in care for people with memory impairments. Similarly, family caregivers and professionals experience extreme burnout with this population, causing ethical dilemmas we can anticipate before they are an issue.

Objectives:

1. Participants will identify ways to apply their skill sets in addressing decisional capacity concerns.
2. As advocates for patient rights, participants will discuss areas of practice where patient rights and dignity are impacted when they have cognitive challenges.
3. Participants will identify and discuss tools of the trade for preparing for end of life, and the significance dementia can have on someone creating advanced directive documents.
